# International Relations (October 2024 to May 2025)

### Visit of Spanish PM to India

- Spanish PM Pedro Sanchez visited India — first visit by a Spanish PM in 18 years.
- **Bilateral Talks**: Held discussions with **PM Modi** to strengthen **strategic and economic ties**.
- Modi's Spain Visit: PM Modi had visited Spain in 2017.

#### C295 Aircraft Assembly Line, Vadodara:

- Inaugurated by Pedro Sanchez in Vadodara, Gujarat.
- India's first private military transport aircraft facility by Tata Advanced Systems Ltd (TASL) and Airbus.
- **Contract**: \$2.5 billion for **56 aircraft** (16 from Spain, 40 assembled in India).
- First Made-in-India C295 to be delivered in 2026, final delivery by 2031.
- Involves **BEL**, **BDL**, and MSMEs to build an aerospace ecosystem.

#### Key Outcomes:

- MoUs signed in trade, IT, infrastructure, renewable energy, defence, pharma, tourism.
- 2026 declared as India-Spain Year of Culture, Tourism, and AI.

#### UK Hands Over Chagos Islands to Mauritius

- Historic Move: UK agrees to transfer sovereignty of Chagos Islands (except Diego Garcia) to Mauritius, ending a colonial-era dispute.
- Treaty Highlights:
  - UK **cedes claims** over Chagos Archipelago.
  - Diego Garcia (UK-US military base) to remain under UK control for 99 years.
  - Mauritius can resettle citizens on other islands.
  - UK pledges a **trust fund** for displaced **Chagossians**.
- India's Role:
  - India supported Mauritius at UNGA (2019).

- In 2024, India inaugurated an airstrip and jetty at Agaléga, strengthening strategic ties.
- About Chagos Islands:
  - **58 islands** in the Indian Ocean.
  - **Diego Garcia** is the largest and most strategic.
- Colonial Timeline:
  - Portuguese  $\rightarrow$  Dutch  $\rightarrow$  French  $\rightarrow$ British control (1814).
  - **1965**: Declared **British Indian Ocean Territory** (BIOT).
  - 1968–1973: Over 1,000
  - Chagossians forcibly evicted.
- Legal Developments:
  - **2015**: PCA ruled UK violated Mauritius' rights.
  - 2019: ICJ ordered UK to return Chagos "as rapidly as possible."
  - UK rejected ICJ jurisdiction; Mauritius claimed coercion during decolonization.
- Strategic Significance:
  - Diego Garcia base: Key for UK-US military operations in Middle East, Africa, and South Asia.
  - Rich **marine biodiversity**; conservation value.

#### Israel's Ban on the UN Secretary-General

- Israel has officially banned United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres from entering the country.
- The decision came amid accusations that Guterres is backing hostile entities such as Hamas, Hezbollah, the Houthis, and Iran.

#### **Reasons Behind the Ban**

- Israel accused the UNSG of failing to unequivocally condemn Iran's missile strikes on Israeli territory.
- It also criticized Guterres for his lack of strong condemnation of the Hamas attack on October 7, 2023, in which:
  - Around 1,200 Israelis were killed, and
  - About **250 people were taken** hostage.

### Prabowo Subianto Sworn In As Indonesia's Eighth President

• Prabowo Subianto has been inaugurated as the 8th President of Indonesia, marking a significant political shift in the country's leadership.

## **Background and Significance**

- A former military general, Subianto's rise is notable given his controversial past, including accusations of human rights abuses during his military career.
- Despite being a long-time political rival of outgoing President Joko Widodo, he was:
  - **Appointed as Defense Minister** in Widodo's cabinet, and
  - **Later endorsed** by Widodo during the presidential election.

## Dragon Drones in the Russia-Ukraine War

 "Dragon drones" have emerged as a lethal new weapon in the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war, capable of releasing molten metal at temperatures of 2,427°C.

## **How They Work**

- These drones release thermite, a chemical mixture of aluminum and iron oxide, which:
  - Ignites in a self-sustaining reaction, and
  - Burns through almost any material, including:
    - Military vehicles, and
      - Targets underwater.
- Thermite causes **severe or fatal burns** on human targets due to extreme heat.

# US Deploys THAAD Missile Defense System to Israel

• The United States has announced the deployment of its THAAD (Terminal High-Altitude Area Defense) missile defense system to Israel, signaling strong support for Israel's security amid regional tensions.

## About THAAD

- THAAD is designed to intercept and destroy ballistic missiles during their terminal (final) phase of flight.
- It offers protection against:

- With a range coverage of up to 5,000 km

#### **Key Features**

- Developed by Lockheed Martin
- Utilizes "hit-to-kill" technology, where interceptors destroy targets through direct impact rather than explosives.
- Offers broader protection compared to the Patriot missile system.

## Kartarpur Corridor Pact Renewed

 India and Pakistan have renewed the Kartarpur Sahib Corridor agreement for another five years, ensuring visafree access for Indian Sikh pilgrims to visit Gurdwara Darbar Sahib in Pakistan.

## Background

- The agreement was **originally signed in** October 2019, and was set to **expire on** October 24, 2024.
- The renewal aims to maintain the uninterrupted operation of the religious corridor.

## About the Kartarpur Corridor

- The corridor connects:
  - Gurdwara Dera Baba Nanak in India, with
  - Gurdwara Darbar Sahib in Kartarpur, Pakistan, where Guru Nanak Dev spent his final years.
- It comprises:
  - A **4.1 km highway** on the Indian side,
  - A **passenger terminal building** at the international border, and
  - The **gurdwara complex** in Pakistan.

### Nepal–India–Bangladesh Sign Tripartite Power Trade Agreement

• Nepal, India, and Bangladesh have signed a tripartite agreement to facilitate cross-border electricity trade, enhancing regional energy cooperation.

## Key Features of the Agreement

- The agreement enables Nepal to export surplus hydroelectricity to Bangladesh through Indian territory.
- Duration of supply: From June 15 to November 15 every year (monsoon season).

## Phase I: Initial Power Supply

- In the first phase, Nepal will:
  - **Export 40 MW** of electricity to Bangladesh.
  - Charge a rate of **6.4 cents per unit**.
  - Generate an estimated annual revenue of **USD 9.2 million**.

## India Signs \$3.5 Billion Deal with US for 31 Predator Drones

 India and the United States have signed a \$3.5-billion defence deal for the acquisition of 31 MQ-9B Predator drones, significantly boosting India's intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance (ISR), and strike capabilities.

## **Details of the Drone Acquisition**

- The deal includes:
  - 15 Sea Guardians for the Indian Navy
  - 8 Sky Guardians each for the Indian Air Force and Indian Army
- These **MQ-9B drones** are equipped with:
  - Hellfire missiles
  - Laser-guided bombs
  - Advanced sensors
- They are designed for **long-endurance** and high-altitude missions, enabling precise targeting and persistent surveillance.

## 2024 US Presidential Election

- Former U.S. President Donald Trump, representing the Republican Party, won a second term in office.
- He defeated Vice-President Kamala Harris, the Democratic nominee, and became the 47th President of the United States.

## The U.S. Presidential Election Process Overview

# Main Telegram Channel

- The **U.S. presidential election** is held every four years to elect the President and Vice President.
- The election follows an indirect voting process:
  - Citizens vote for a slate of electors.
  - These electors then formally vote for the President and Vice President in the Electoral College.

## Constitutional Requirements for Presidential Candidates

According to the **U.S. Constitution**, a presidential candidate must:

- Be a **natural-born citizen** of the United States
- Be at least 35 years old
- Have been a resident of the U.S. for at least 14 years

# India Becomes Top Source of International Students in the US (2023–2024)

- India has overtaken China as the largest source of international students in the United States for the 2023–2024 academic year, marking a historic shift after 15 years.
- The total number of Indian students in the US has reached 3.3 lakh (330,000).

## Key Highlights

- India and China together account for nearly 50% of the international student population in the US.
- Most students pursue **STEM fields** such as:
  - Computer Science
  - o Engineering
  - Mathematics

## **Economic Contribution**

- In **2023, Indian students contributed \$50 billion** to the **US economy** through:
  - Tuition fees
  - Living expenses

## **Global Trend**

- The rise in Indian students studying abroad is **not limited to the US**:
  - In the UK, Indian student numbers rose by 39% in 2022–

## 2023, also surpassing China.

## PM Modi's Visit to Nigeria

• Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited Nigeria, marking the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister since 2007.

## **Key Engagements**

- PM Modi met with **President Bola Ahmed Tinubu**.
- He held **delegation-level talks** to strengthen bilateral cooperation.
- He also **addressed the Indian diaspora** in **Abuja**, emphasizing India–Nigeria ties.

# Honour Received

- PM Modi was conferred with Nigeria's prestigious "Grand Commander of the Order of Niger",
  - A national honour previously awarded only to Queen Elizabeth II.

# **Major Outcomes**

- Three Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) were signed on:
  - Cultural exchange
  - Customs cooperation
  - Survey collaboration
- India provided 20 tonnes of relief material for flood victims in Nigeria as a humanitarian gesture.

# India–Nigeria Bilateral Trade

# Trade Volume

- Annual bilateral trade exceeds USD 14 billion, making Nigeria India's largest trading partner in Africa.
- However, trade has declined in recent years, primarily due to:
  - India reducing Nigerian oil imports in favor of cheaper Russian alternatives.

# **Key Imports and Exports**

# • India's Imports from Nigeria:

- **Crude oil** dominates, accounting for **over 70%** of total imports.
- India is among the largest buyers of Nigerian oil.
- India's Exports to Nigeria:
  - Pharmaceuticals
  - Engineering goods
  - Automobiles
  - Agricultural machinery
  - o **Textiles**

# Indian Investments in Nigeria

- Indian companies employ the secondlargest workforce in Nigeria after the government.
- **Cumulative Indian investments** in Nigeria are valued at around **\$27 billion**.

# Taliban Appoint Ikramuddin Kamil as 'Acting Consul' in Mumbai

- The Taliban regime has appointed Ikramuddin Kamil as the "acting consul" at the Afghan Mission in Mumbai.
- This marks the first official appointment by the Taliban in India since their takeover of Afghanistan in 2021.

# UK's Assisted Dying Bill

The Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill was introduced in the UK to provide terminally ill patients with the option to seek assistance to end their lives.

# US Court Holds Israeli Company NSO Liable for Targeting WhatsApp Users

- Meta's WhatsApp secured a significant legal win as a US federal court found the Israeli firm NSO Group liable under federal and California laws for spyware attacks
- WhatsApp had sued NSO in 2019, accusing it of using Pegasus spyware to hack and surveil the phones of nearly 1,400 individuals during a two-week period in May 2019. The court will now determine the damages.

## Impeachment of South Korea's President Yoon Suk Yeol

- South Korea's National Assembly initiated the impeachment process against Yoon Suk Yeol after securing a majority vote to proceed with the motion.
- The impeachment was based on allegations of abuse of power, violation of constitutional rights, and failure to uphold democratic principles.

# Joe Biden Pardons His Son Hunter Biden in Two Federal Cases

- U.S. President Joe Biden has issued a full and unconditional pardon to his son Hunter Biden.
- The pardon covers:

- $\circ$  Tax evasion
- **Lying about drug use** while purchasing a **firearm**

### **Possible Future Pardons**

- President Biden is reportedly considering pre-emptive pardons for:
  - Vice President Kamala Harris
  - Former Chief Medical Officer Anthony Fauci
  - Republican Congresswoman Liz Cheney
- These measures aim to protect allies from potential prosecution under President-elect Donald Trump.

### The U.S. President's Power to Pardon

- The President of the United States has the constitutional authority to grant pardons and commute sentences for federal crimes.
  - State crimes are not covered under this power.

#### Legal Interpretation

- The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that:
  - The pardon power is "granted without limit"
  - **Congress cannot restrict** this power
  - It is a discretionary and broad executive authority

#### **No Accountability Required**

- The President is:
  - Not answerable for the pardons issued
  - Not required to provide any justification for granting clemency

#### Nepal-China Sign 9-Point Agreement

- Nepal and China signed a nine-point agreement during Nepalese Prime Minister K.P. Sharma Oli's four-day official visit to China.
- A major highlight was the signing of the long-awaited Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) Cooperation Framework Agreement.

#### **Key Highlights**

 Although Nepal and China originally signed the BRI agreement in 2017, no project has been implemented under it so far.

#### Main Telegram Channel

- During the visit, both sides reaffirmed commitment to activate and operationalize BRI cooperation.
- The Trans-Himalayan Multi-Dimensional Connectivity Network (THMDCN) was discussed as a key initiative under the BRI framework.

#### Australia's Online Safety Amendment (Social-Media Minimum Age) Bill, 2024

 Australia's House of Representatives has passed the Online Safety Amendment Bill, 2024, aimed at protecting children online by setting a minimum age limit of 16 years for creating social media accounts.

#### **Key Provisions**

- Social media platforms must take **"reasonable steps"** to prevent users **under 16** from registering.
- The Bill amends the Age Discrimination Act, 2024.

#### China to Build the World's Largest Hydropower Dam on the Yarlung Tsangpo (Brahmaputra)

- China has approved the construction of the world's largest hydropower dam on the lower reaches of the Yarlung Tsangpo River (Brahmaputra) in Tibet.
- The project will generate 300 billion kilowatt-hours (kWh) of electricity annually—more than three times the capacity of the current world leader, the Three Gorges Dam.

# China's Brahmaputra Dam Project: Key Details

#### **Location and Rationale**

- Being built in Medog County, Tibet Autonomous Region, where the Yarlung Tsangpo drops 2,000 meters, creating ideal conditions for hydropower.
- The project is a part of:
  - China's 14th Five-Year Plan (2021–2025), and
  - Long-Range Objectives through 2035.

#### Strategic and Economic Significance

 Projected capacity: Up to 60 gigawatts (GW) — triple that of the Three Gorges Dam.

- Annual production: 300 billion kWh of clean, renewable energy.
- Supports China's goal of carbon neutrality by 2060.
- Expected to generate 20 billion yuan (\$3 billion) annually for the Tibetan region.
- Helps bolster China's energy security and regional development in Tibet.

### New Suez Canal Channel Extension

- Egypt has successfully tested a new 10 km channel in the southern section of the Suez Canal, extending the two-way section from 72 km to 82 km and increasing the canal's total length to 193 km.
- The Suez Canal is a man-made waterway that connects the Mediterranean Sea to the Red Sea in Egypt.
- The expansion aims to boost daily capacity by 6 to 8 ships and improve the canal's ability to handle emergencies.
- Following the 2021 grounding of the container ship Ever Given that blocked the vital waterway for six days, Egypt accelerated plans to extend the second channel in the southern reaches of the canal and widen the existing channel.
- Despite the improvements, the canal's revenue dropped over 60% in 2024, with losses of approximately \$7 billion, due to attacks by Yemen's Houthi militants on vessels in the Red Sea since November 2023.

## Visit of Sri Lankan President to India

• Sri Lanka's President Anura Kumara Dissanayake (AKD) visited India recently. This was his first trip overseas since becoming leader of his country.

## Key Highlights of The Visit

- Bilateral Development Cooperation
  - Key projects include:
    - Phase III & IV of the Indian Housing Project.
    - Three islands' Hybrid Renewable Energy Project.
    - High Impact Community
       Development Projects.

- Enhancing Physical Connectivity
  - Resumption of passenger ferry services between:
    - Nagapattinam and Kankesanthurai.
    - Rameswaram and Talaimannar (under review).
  - Discussions on rehabilitating Sri Lanka's Kankesanthurai port are underway.

#### Trade Watch Report by NITI Aayog– Key Findings

- Limited success in 'China Plus One' strategy:
  - India has had "limited success" in leveraging the 'China Plus One' strategy aimed at diversifying global supply chains away from China.
  - Southeast Asian countries like Vietnam, Thailand, Malaysia, and Cambodia have performed better due to cheaper labour, simplified tax laws, lower tariffs, and proactive FTAs.
- Trade fragmentation and export control measures:
  - India faces stiff export competition from Malaysia and Thailand, especially in sectors like electrical machinery.

## **Future Prospects:**

## Impact of Trump's trade policies:

- General US tariffs on imports (e.g., 10%) may not adversely affect India.
- High tariffs on Chinese goods (e.g., 60%) could open major export opportunities for India.
- Focus on diversification and market expansion:

#### India and Bhutan Strengthen Bilateral Ties with Focus on Hydropower and Urban Planning

King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuk and Queen Jetsun Pema of Bhutan visited India. **Key Highlights:** 

• Support for Gelephu Mindfulness City Project (GMC):

- PM Modi assured continued Indian support for the GMC project.
- GMC is a Special Administrative Region in Bhutan aimed at enhancing prosperity, border connectivity, and economic cooperation.

## • Progress in Hydropower Projects:

- Both sides reviewed the 1020 MW Punatsangchhu-II project, which is nearing completion.
- Discussed early conclusion of the Punatsangchhu-I project.
- Recent High-Level Engagements Bhutanese PM Tshering Tobgay's participation in the Global Cooperatives Conference in New Delhi.

### Kash Patel – Trump's Pick for FBI Chief

- Kashyap "Kash" Patel, Indian-American lawyer. Nominated by Donald Trump as FBI Director, replacing Christopher Wray.
- Born on February 25, 1980, in Garden City (Long Island), New York, to Gujarati-Indian immigrant parents his father from Uganda and mother from Tanzania. His ancestors had migrated from Anand District, Gujarat to Uganda 70-80 years ago.

#### Nepal Army Chief Conferred Honorary Rank by President Murmu

- President Droupadi Murmu conferred the honorary rank of 'General of Indian Army' on Nepal's Army Chief General Ashok Raj Sigdel in New Delhi.
- There has been a tradition of conferring the title of Honorary General on each other's Army chiefs since 1950.
- The honor recognizes his military prowess and contribution to fostering Nepal-India relations.

## Suspension of MFN Clause in India-Switzerland Tax Treaty

 Switzerland has announced the suspension of the Most-Favoured-Nation (MFN) clause under the Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA) with India, effective January 1, 2025.

## Main Telegram Channel

- This move could lead to higher tax burdens for Indian companies operating in Switzerland and Swiss investors in India, potentially impacting bilateral investments.
- The Swiss government suspended the MFN clause citing **lack of reciprocity** from India. Swiss authorities stated they **could not apply reduced tax rates unilaterally** without **mutual agreement** from India.

# India's Eastern Maritime Corridor (EMC)

- India became the largest buyer of Russian oil in 2024, surpassing China.
- EMC connects Chennai to Vladivostok, boosting India–Russia trade.
- Transit time reduced to 24 days (from 40+ via St. Petersburg–Mumbai route).
- Lower shipping costs make Russian crude more affordable.
- Ports in use:
  - Russia: Vladivostok (largest Pacific port).
  - India: Chennai, Paradip,
     Visakhapatnam, Tuticorin,
     Ennore, Kolkata.

# India-Australia Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (Ind-Aus ECTA)

- **Background**: Signed in **April 2022**; came into effect on **29 December 2022**.
- **Objective**: Strengthen bilateral trade, reduce tariffs, and boost MSMEs and employment.

# Key Highlights:

- Surge in Trade:
  - Bilateral trade rose from USD
     12.2 billion (2020–21) to USD 26
     billion (2022–23).
  - Trade in 2023–24 moderated to USD 24 billion; India's exports grew 14%.
  - From April–Nov 2024, trade stood at USD 16.3 billion.
- Tariff Benefits:

- 85% of Australian exports to India became tariff-free in 2022; to rise to 90% in six years.
- 96% of Indian exports to Australia now tariff-free; to reach 100% by 2026.
- Utilization:
  - In 2023, export utilization: 79%, import utilization: 84%, indicating effective use of the agreement.
- Future Goal: ECTA is a stepping stone to the full Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA).

### India–France Pact for National Museum

- Agreement Signed: For "adaptive reuse" of North and South Blocks under the Central Vista Project.
- **Objective**: Create the **world's largest national museum** (1.55 lakh sq. m), surpassing the Louvre.
- Phases:
  - Phase 1: North Block retrofitting into a museum; target June 2026.
- French Involvement: France to provide expertise (e.g., Grand Louvre experience).
- Ministries Shift:
  - North Block (Finance, Home Affairs) to be vacated by March 2025.
  - **South Block** (PMO, External Affairs) to be vacated later.

#### India's Reliance on China for Critical Minerals

- Ministry of Mines Report (2023): Identified 30 critical minerals vital for economic development and national security.
- **Import Dependency**: Complete import reliance for **10 critical minerals**.

#### Dependency on China (2019–2024):

India heavily relies on China for 6 key minerals:

• **Bismuth (85.6%)** – Pharmaceuticals, chemicals

- Lithium (82%) EV batteries, energy storage
- Silicon (76%) Semiconductors, solar panels
- Titanium (50.6%) Aerospace, defense
- **Tellurium (48.8%)** Solar, thermoelectric devices
- Graphite (42.4%) EV batteries, steel production

#### Southern California Wildfires 2025

- Location: Los Angeles, California
- Impact: Dozens killed, 130,000+ evacuated, celebrity homes (e.g., Paris Hilton) destroyed
- Major Fires: Palisades, Eaton, Sunset, Hurst, Lidia – affecting Hollywood Hills
- **Unusual**: Intense **winter wildfires**, rare for the region's Mediterranean climate

#### Causes:

- 1. Hydroclimate Whiplash:
  - Wet winters (2022–23) → dense vegetation
  - Exceptionally dry 2024–25 winter
     → dry kindling
  - NASA: Driest start to LA water year since 1944
  - ClimaMeter: Fires linked to abrupt wet–dry shifts
- 2. Santa Ana Winds:
  - Hot, dry winds from inland deserts
  - Caused by high-pressure over Great Basin
  - Descending air heats, loses moisture, accelerates through mountain passes
  - Speeds over **100 mph** spread fires rapidly

#### 3. Climate Change:

 Rising global temps, early snowmelt, dry vegetation → longer fire seasons

#### Key Features of Santa Ana Winds:

- Hot, dry, strong
- Originate from Great Basin

• Cause **property damage**, power cuts, wildfire spread

## Pink Fire Retardant in California Wildfires

- Used in Wildfire Control: Sprayed by planes and helicopters; 9 aircraft use pink retardant, 20 drop water.
- **Purpose: Chemical mixture** designed to **slow or extinguish fire spread**.
- Common Brand: Phos-Chek widely used in the U.S.

## **Composition of Phos-Chek**:

- Water + Ammonium Phosphate (fertilizer) + rust-based red dye
- Ammonium Phosphate:
  - Cools and coats fuel
  - Reduces oxygen
  - Alters how fuel burns
  - Longer-lasting than water

## Additives:

- **Thickening agents** prevent drift, improve application control
- **Pink Dye** Improves visibility for firefighters; most visible and aesthetically pleasing color.

## Trump Ends Birthright Citizenship

• Executive Order signed to end birthright citizenship for children of undocumented or temporarily present parents.

## **Excluded Categories:**

- 1. Unlawful Presence:
  - Mother in U.S. illegally
  - Father not a U.S. citizen or permanent resident

## 2. Lawful but Temporary Presence:

- Mother on visa or waiver program
- Father not a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Claim: Such individuals are not under U.S. jurisdiction, so children won't get automatic citizenship.

## U.S. Withdrawal from Paris Agreement

On January 20, President Donald
 Trump signed an executive order to

# China's Population declined for the third consecutive year.

- Figure: 1.408 billion by end of 2024.
- **Decline**: Decreased by **1.39 million** from the previous year.

### Russian Gas Exports to Europe via Ukraine Halted

- Reason: Transit deal expired; no new agreement between Moscow and Kyiv.
- Impact: Ends Russia's oldest gas route to Europe.

# Urengoy-Pomary-Uzhgorod Pipeline:

- Transports gas from **Siberia** via **Sudzha** (Kursk region, Russia).
- Passes through Ukraine → Slovakia, with branches to Czech Republic and Austria.
- **Transdniestria** (bordering Ukraine) also receives Russian gas via this route.

# Panama Canal Treaty & U.S. Concerns

- Trump's Statement: Criticized the 1999 Panama Canal handover, calling the treaty "foolish" and threatened to reclaim control.
- Panama Canal:

- Location: Great Bend in Medog County, Tibet — just before river enters Arunachal Pradesh.
- Planned as the world's largest dam on Yarlung Tsangpo (Brahmaputra).
- India's Stand:
  - China did not notify India.
  - Urged transparency, consultation, and protection of downstream interests.
  - Asserted India's established rights as a lower riparian state.

# Donald Trump Offers 'Gold Card' Visas For US Citizenship

- US President Donald Trump introduced a new "gold card" immigration initiative, replacing the EB-5 visa program. For a \$5 million investment, wealthy foreign investors can gain a path to U.S. citizenship and permanent residency.
- The existing EB-5 program, established in 1990, requires a minimum investment of \$1.05 million (or \$800,000 in distressed areas) to create or preserve jobs. It has faced criticism for fraud and misuse, including funding projects linked to Trump family businesses.
- In 2023, only 631 Indians obtained Green Cards through the EB-5 program.

# Tea Horse Road Connecting India – China

- Recently, China's Ambassador to India Xu Feihong posted on X (Twitter) about the historic Tea Horse Road which spanned more than 2,000 km, and connected China to India via Tibet.
- The Tea Horse Road, played a key role in commerce and cultural exchange for centuries.
- While less famous than the Silk Road, this route facilitated the movement of tea, horses, and other valuable commodities across some of the world's most challenging terrains.

## Cook Islands, China Sign Comprehensive Strategic Partnership Deal

## **US Deports Illegal Indian Migrants**

The first U.S. military aircraft carrying 104 deported Indian nationals landed in Amritsar in the first week of February 2025. This marks the beginning of a stringent crackdown on illegal immigration under President Donald Trump's administration.

- Former U.S. President Donald Trump signed an executive order establishing a Strategic Bitcoin Reserve and a US Digital Asset Stockpile.
- The Bitcoin reserve will be funded with BTC forfeited in criminal or civil asset seizures, providing the U.S. with a strategic advantage. Similarly, the Digital Asset Stockpile will include other forfeited digital assets.

#### Nepal's Political Turmoil & Monarchist Revival

- **Context**: Public protests demand return of monarchy; Former King Gyanendra Shah emerges as a symbol of frustration for ruling govt.
- **Reasons**: Corruption scandals, political instability, and economic decline under ruling govt.

- **Developments**: Pro-monarchy protests in Kathmandu; ruling MPs seek Shah's arrest; RPP (Rashtriya Prajatantra Party) supports monarchy revival.
- Implication: Threat to Nepal's republican structure; possible conflict or dialogue with royalist factions.

  - Boosts Indo-US civil nuclear cooperation.
  - Aids India's transition to Pressurised Water Reactor (PWR) tech.

- Counters China's lead in SMR development.
- Challenges:
  - Legal: India's Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act, 2010.
  - Policy: Atomic Energy Act, 1962 restricts private sector entry.

#### India Rejects USCIRF Report

- India termed the **USCIRF 2025 Report** as biased and politically motivated.
- The report accused India of targeting religious minorities and recommended "Country of Particular Concern (CPC)" status and sanctions against R&AW.

  - Former Bishop in **Peru**, led **Augustinian Order**.
  - Served in **Dicastery for Bishops** in the Vatican.

# Colombia Joins China's BRI

- Joined: Belt and Road Initiative during Beijing summit.
- Significance:
  - Marks Colombia's foreign policy pivot towards China.
  - Now, ~2/3 of Latin America is part of BRI.
- Notable Project: Chancay Port in Peru

   Latin America's first China-funded BRI
   port.
- China-CELAC Forum:
  - Xi Jinping pledged **\$9.2 billion** in credit for the Global South.
  - Focus: Infrastructure, clean energy, education, counterterrorism.
- Strategic Angle:
  - U.S. worried about China's influence near Panama Canal.
  - U.S. exploring acquiring Chinesecontrolled ports.

- Issue: French-brokered deal collapsed • in May 2025.
- **Background**:
  - French Pacific territory with ~2.7 lakh people.
  - Nouméa Accord (1998) gave 0 semi-autonomy.
- Tensions:
  - Pro-independence Kanak groups oppose French rule.
  - Past referendums (3) rejected independence.
  - Deadlock over voter rights and 0 "sovereignty in partnership" model.

## **UK-EU Post-Brexit Summit**

- First Formal Summit since Brexit.
- **Trade Agreements:** 
  - EU gets 12-year fishing rights in 0 UK waters.
  - UK gains access to **EU plant &** animal markets under SPS rules.
  - **Carbon markets** to be linked.
- Security & Foreign Policy:
  - Regular dialogues every 6 months.
  - o UK may access EU's €150 billion defence loan fund.
  - Cooperation on space, sanctions, and migration.
- Youth & Mobility:
  - Talks to restart student exchanges.
  - Propose a capped youth mobility program.

### **Trump Blocks Harvard from Enrolling International Students**

- Reason: Harvard refused to comply with Trump's executive order on campus free speech.
- Trigger: Protests over Israel-Gaza war, alleged bias and harassment of Jewish students.

#### Main Telegram Channel

- **Court Ruling:** Temporarily blocks administration's move against Harvard.
- Wider Context:
  - Other elite colleges like Columbia, Cornell under scrutiny.
  - Move linked to criticism of liberal dominance in academia.

#### **Student and Exchange Visitor Program** (SEVP)

- Administered by: U.S. Department of Homeland Security.
- Required for: F-1, M-1, and J-1 visa holders.
- **Kev Feature:** 
  - Institutions need SEVP
    - certification to issue Form I-20.
- Visas:
  - F-1: Academic students (universities, English programs).
  - M-1: Vocational or non-0 academic programs.
  - J-1: Exchange visitors for educational/cultural programs.

## One Big Beautiful Bill (U.S.)

- Passed by: U.S. House of Representatives; awaits Senate approval.
- **Key Provisions:** 
  - $\circ$ Permanent extension of **2017 tax** cuts.
  - **Tax relief** on overtime, tips, and Social Security income.
  - Increased spending on border security and military.
  - Promotes government efficiency and raises debt ceiling.

## **GENIUS Act (U.S. Crypto Bill)**

- Full Form: Guiding and Establishing National Innovation for US Stablecoins.
- **Key Provisions**:
  - 1:1 Reserve backing for stablecoins.
  - Mandatory AML/terror financing compliance.

- Separation of funds between issuers and reserves.
- **Third-party audits** and transparency rules.
- **Impact**: Bitcoin crossed **\$110,000** due to investor optimism.

#### **UK Transfers Chagos Islands to Mauritius**

- **Deal Signed**: By UK PM Keir Starmer.
- Key Points:
  - UK returns sovereignty to **Mauritius**.
  - Lease-back of Diego Garcia to UK for 99 years (£3.4 billion total).
  - Diego Garcia remains key US-UK military base.
- Historical Context:
  - UK separated Chagos from Mauritius in **1965** for Cold War use.
  - Diego Garcia was used in Afghanistan, Gaza & Yemen operations.

#### Visit of President of Angola to India

- **President**: Joao Lourenco's **first state visit** to India (after 38 years).
- Major Outcomes:
  - **\$200 million defence credit line** to Angola.
  - Expansion of ties in **energy**, **mining**, **pharma**, **agriculture**.
  - Affirmation of India-Africa solidarity as Global South partners.
- Trade: Bilateral trade reached \$4.19 billion (2023–24).

#### India Rejects China's Renaming of Arunachal Pradesh

- India's Stand: Firmly rejected China's renaming of **27 locations**.
- China's Claim: Considers Arunachal as part of "Southern Tibet" (~90,000 sq km).
- Pattern: China has renamed places in 2017, 2021, 2023, 2024, and now 2025.

 India's Response: Arunachal is an integral part of India.

#### Golden Dome – U.S. Missile Defence Plan

- **Proposed by**: Donald Trump in 2025.
- Inspired by: Israel's Iron Dome.
- **Goal**: Use **space-based satellites** and interceptors to neutralize ICBMs post-launch.
- **Budget: \$175 billion**, led by U.S. Space Force.
- Status: Faces concerns over feasibility, funding, and 2029 timeline.
